3. 63 sweets are shared equally between 8 children. How many are left over?

4. 19 sweets are shared equally between 6 children. How many are left over?

5. 19 mangoes are shared equally between 2 baskets, and the rest are kept back. How many mangoes are in each basket?

6. 13 sweets are shared equally between 3 children, and the rest are kept back. How many sweets does each child get?

7. 38 mangoes are shared equally between 4 baskets, and the rest are kept back. How many mangoes are in each basket?

8. 17 passengers are going on a trip. Each boat holds 5. How many boats are needed?

9. 16 pupils are going on a trip. Each minibus holds 5. How many minibuses are needed?
10. 37 pupils are going on a trip. Each minibus holds 5. How many minibuses are needed?
11. 27 passengers are going on a trip. Each boat holds 4. How many boats are needed?
12. 23 metres of rope are cut into 4-metre pieces. How many whole pieces are there?
13. 17 metres of ribbon are cut into 3-metre lengths. How many whole lengths are there?
14. 34 metres of ribbon are cut into 6-metre lengths. How many whole lengths are there?
